On September 2, 1983, the Board of Indian Appeals received a motion to dismiss the above case from appellant. The case, which was referred to the Board by the Assistant Secretary--Indian Affairs on August 8, 1983, involved the use of appellant's per capita payments for repayment of indebtedness owed to the Three Affiliated Tribes. Appellant had apparently unsuccessfully sought a setoff against the indebtedness to the tribe for certain wages allegedly owed to him by the tribe.

According to appellant's motion to dismiss, the tribe has honored appellant's setoff claim. Therefore, appellant states that the appeal is now moot.

Based on appellant's representations the motion to dismiss is granted.
