Appellant Skagit County, Washington, sought review of an August 16, 2002, decision of the Acting Northwest Regional Director, Bureau of Indian Affairs (Regional Director), to take approximately 76.9 acres of land and related shorelands in the vicinity of Campbell Lake in Skagit County, into trust for the Samish Indian Nation (Tribe). On July 6, 2004, the Board of Indian Appeals (Board) received from Appellant a stipulated motion to dismiss this appeal, executed by all of the parties. The motion indicates that the County and the Tribe have reached a settlement concerning this matter, and the Regional Director does not object to dismissal of the County's appeal.

The stipulated motion to dismiss is granted. The Board appreciates the parties' successful efforts to settle this matter.

Pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 C.F.R. § 4.1, this appeal is dismissed on the basis of a settlement reached between the parties.
