The Board of Indian Appeals issued a decision in this case on August 18, 1988. 16 IBIA 201. On September 19, 1988, the Board received a motion for reconsideration from appellant.

Reconsideration of appeals by the Board is governed by 43 CFR 4.315, which provides in relevant part: "Reconsideration of a decision by the Board will be granted only in extraordinary circumstances. \* \* \* The petition \* \* \* shall contain a detailed statement of the reasons why reconsideration should be granted." The present motion essentially repeats the arguments raised in the initial appeal and urges the Board to reexamine certain parts of the administrative record. The Board took all of appellant's arguments into consideration and thoroughly reviewed the administrative record prior to issuing its initial decision. Appellant has not demonstrated that there are extraordinary circumstances warranting reconsideration in this case.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 CFR 4.1, appellant's motion for reconsideration is denied.
