This appeal concerns an April 20, 1989, decision of the Acting Portland Area Director, Bureau of Indian Affairs, approving the sale of land held in trust for a member of the Tulalip Tribes to a non-Indian. Appellant alleged in its notice of appeal that BIA failed to give it notice of the approval.

On November 13, 1989, the Board received a joint motion for dismissal from appellant and appellee. The motion states that the parties have agreed to settle the appeal on the condition that the Area Director issue a memorandum to the Superintendent, Puget Sound Agency, concerning notification requirements before sales of trust land are approved. A copy of the memorandum, dated October 27, 1989, was attached to the motion.

Pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 CFR 4.1, and at the request of the parties, the settlement reached by the parties is approved, and this appeal from the April 20, 1989, decision of the Acting Portland Area Director is dismissed.
