Appellant Oglala Sioux Tribe sought review of a January 31, 1991, decision issued by the Acting Director, Office of Trust and Economic Development, Bureau of Indian Affairs. The decision awarded appellant \$115,000 for a one-year study of the oil and gas potential on the Pine Ridge Reservation. Appellant indicated that, despite the award, there were problems with the decision.

On June 8, 1992, the Board received a motion from appellant asking that its appeal be dismissed with prejudice.

Accordingly, pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 CFR 4.1, this appeal from the January 31, 1991, decision of the Acting Director, Office of Trust and Economic Development, Bureau of Indian Appeals, is dismissed with prejudice.
