On January 22, 2001, the Board of Indian Appeals received an apparent notice of appeal from Jim Brown, III (Appellant). It appeared from Appellant's filing that he was attempting to appeal to the Board from a December 18, 2000, decision issued by the Superintendent, Central California Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs, concerning a November 4, 2000, election held by the Elem Indian Colony.

By order of January 23, 2001, the Board required Appellant to state whether or not he intended to appeal to the Board and, if he did so intend, to state why he believed the Board had jurisdiction over the appeal. The order informed Appellant that failure to respond by February 26, 2001, would result in dismissal of this appeal.

Appellant did not respond.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 C.F.R. § 4.1, this appeal is docketed and dismissed.
