On February 20, 2001, the Board of Indian Appeals received a document from Marin Audubon Society (Appellant) which appeared to be a notice of appeal from a December 22, 2000, decision of the Pacific Regional Director, Bureau of Indian Affairs, to take 321 acres in Sonoma County, California, into trust for the Hopland Band of Pomo Indians of the Hopland Rancheria.

The document did not show that it had been served on the interested parties. The Board therefore ordered Appellant to serve the parties and to file a certificate of service with the Board showing that it had done so. Appellant was given until March 28, 2001, to comply with the Board's order and informed that failure to comply by that date would result in dismissal of its appeal for failure to prosecute.

No certificate of service has been received.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 C.F.R. § 4.1, this appeal is docketed but is dismissed for failure to prosecute.
