) RECOMMENDING DISMISSAL

On June 23, 1997, a voluntary withdrawal of appeal was received from Appellant by and through its attorney, Claudeen Bates Arthur, who requested that that case be dismissed without prejudice.

Based upon representations contained in the Withdrawal of Appeal and Appellee's Motion to Dismiss, dismissal without prejudice is responsible and fair to both parties.

IT IS, THEREFORE, RECOMMENDED that this matter be dismissed without prejudice.

Within 30 days of receipt of this recommended decision, either party may file an objection to it with the Interior Board of Indian Appeals (IBIA) pursuant to 25 CFR 900.165 at Board of Indian Appeals, 4015 Wilson Blvd, Arlington VA 22203. The appealing party shall serve copies of its notice of appeal on the opposing party or parties and on the official whose decision is being appealed. The appealing party shall certify to the IBIA that it has served these copies. If neither party files an objection to the recommended decision within 30 days, the recommended decision will become final.
