The State of California; Taha Saleh, Shop N Save Market, and the Coalition of Retailers; and Tulare County, California, appealed to the Board of Indian Appeals (Board) from a January 4, 2011, decision of the Pacific Regional Director (Regional Director), Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), to approve the acceptance into trust of approximately 40 acres of land located in Tulare County, California, by the United States for the Tule River Indian Tribe of California (Tribe). On October 16, 2012, the Board received a letter from the Tribe asking that the Regional Director's decision be withdrawn and these appeals dismissed. Subsequently, the Tribe clarified that it seeks to have its trust application withdrawn entirely from BIA's consideration.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 C.F.R. § 4.1, the Board vacates the Regional Director's January 4, 2011, decision, and dismisses these appeals.
