The Ak-Chin Indian Community (Community) appealed to the Board of Indian Appeals (Board) from an April 28, 2009, decision of the Western Regional Director (Regional Director), Bureau of Indian Affairs, in which the Regional Director declined the Community's request to cancel a right-of-way held by the State of Arizona across lands held in trust for the Community in Arizona.

The parties have been engaged in settlement negotiations since August 2011. On March 19, 2013, the Board received a stipulation signed by the Community and by the Regional Director. The parties report that all of the issues raised in the appeal have been resolved, and they request the dismissal of this appeal with prejudice. The Board extends its appreciation to the parties for their successful efforts in resolving these disputes.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 C.F.R. § 4.1, the Board dismisses this appeal with prejudice.
