Michelle Roberts and other individuals (collectively, Appellants)¹ appealed to the Board of Indian Appeals (Board) from the alleged failure of the Northwest Regional Director (Regional Director), Bureau of Indian Affairs, to respond to a February 24, 2015, request for action or decision made pursuant to 25 C.F.R. § 2.8 (appeal from inaction of official). The Board requested a status report from the Regional Director, who submitted a status report and moved to dismiss the appeal on the grounds that Regional Director had responded to Appellants by letter dated March 2, 2015. On May 7, 2015, the Board received from Appellants a notice voluntarily withdrawing this appeal.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority delegated to the Board of Indian Appeals by the Secretary of the Interior, 43 C.F.R. § 4.1, the Board docketed and dismisses the appeal.
